Cynthia England has developed a new and really clever technique in which to paper piece from the **RIGHT-SIDE** of the fabric. That's right; using her new technique you build your block/pattern using the right-side of the fabric so you see what you get as you go along.

Her technique of 'Picture Piecing' is easy to learn and fun to do. It looks like Paper Piecing, but it's not! What's different?

- No paper to pick out
- No fabric waste - cut out exactly what you need
- What you see is what you get!
- Can reuse the pattern
- Use a regular stitch length
- You can "chain stitch" in larger sections
- You can CHEAT!

If you don't sew it perfectly, don't rip it out! You can either sew closer, or pick the paper pattern up and move it!

Blender Cheesecake

This is an old family recipe that is made this time of year for the holidays. I hope you try it and enjoy!

Crust:

3 Tablespoons melted butter
2 Tablespoons sugar

Topping:

1 Cup sour cream
1 Tablespoon sugar
½ tsp vanilla

Filling:

2 eggs separated
½ Cup sugar
1 Tablespoon lemon juice
Thin rind of ½ lemon
½ tsp vanilla
1 lb cream cheese cubed

Recipe Corner!

Crust: Make a crumb crust and press into pan on bottom and sides (8x8x2). Bake 5 minutes at 300°. **Filling:** Put egg yolks, sugar, lemon juice, lemon rind, vanilla and half of the cream cheese into a blender and blend until smooth. Gradually add remaining cream cheese, blend until smooth. Beat egg whites until stiff and then fold into cheese mixture. Pour into crust and bake 45 minutes @300°. **Topping:** Blend sour cream, sugar and vanilla and spread on top of cheese cake. Return to oven and bake for 10 minutes longer @ 300° *Enjoy!*

Cynthia teaches and lectures nationally and internationally. In addition, she is the designer and owner of England Design Studios which is a publishing/pattern company which specializes in the “Picture Piecing technique. She has designed over 60 patterns that use this technique.

Paper Piecing Tip:

When a piece is too small to handle easily when sewing, try pinning it to a piece of tissue paper (4"x 4"). You can then hold onto the tissue paper as you sew the piece and once sewn, just tear off the tissue paper.
